A space X is functionally countable if for every continuous $f: X \to \mathbb{R}$, f(X) is countable. This class includes all scattered compacta, ordinals, σ -products in 2^{κ} , some trees, some Ψ -spaces. We consider several alternative definitions of functional separability the most obvious of which is having a dense functionally countable subspace. (Received August 04, 2008)
